

Orff Schulwerk Training Program

June 15-26, 2009

Comprehensive curriculum approved by American Orff Schulwerk Association will be presented in these courses designed to help music teachers understand the rationale and sequence of the Orff pedagogy, further develop their own musicianship, and apply the pedagogy to the classroom.

The workshops follow a spiraled approach where introductory experiences move into and through progressively more sophisticated instructional strategies. Musical composition and improvisation are focused on placing children's learning needs in the forefront.

Classes will run from 9:00 am until approximately 5:00 pm each day in Frasier Hall on the UNC Campus. (No Saturday or Sunday classes).

All required materials (except binders and manuscript paper) will be available onsite through a representative of West Music.

CLOTHING & CLIMATE

Dress for sessions is casual and comfortable. Classrooms are air-conditioned and some can become quite cold so pack a sweater or light jacket. Our average June temperatures range from 83 degrees for the high to 54 degrees for the low with 35% humidity and we boast 270 days of sunshine. We are located at an elevation of 4,658 feet.

HOUSING

On campus housing is available at UNC in a brand new residence hall on the west campus. All reservations must be paid for on or before arrival. Contact Short Term Housing Staff at (970) 351-4070. The 2009 rate is: Double (2 people per bedroom) \$26.80/night or Single (1 person per bedroom) \$36.80/night. Bedding supplies are furnished.

A word about residence halls: UNC residence halls are good student housing, not hotels. There is no maid service, there are shared facilities, BUT it is very convenient. If you have misgivings about residence halls, please consider the hotel option.

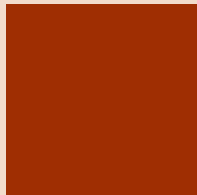
